Gerrard returned to long-form film making after successfully running an independent news production company, News-Source UK, that produced news, entertainment and documentary programming for Sony Entertainment Television and the breakfast program for European Business News (now CNBC Europe). He has also produced corporate videos for various United Nations departments, Hilton Hotels, Berjaya Bay Hotels, Sychelles Airlines, Weavering Capital and has advised on the use of video inserts into many web-based products. He has recently made documentary films in Kenya, Argentina and Albania, which have been broadcast by Al-Jazeera International, STC in Portugal, Channel 4 News in the UK and SKY News.
